DEFENSIBLE SPACE & HOME HARDENING ORDINANCES



Ember Resistant Zone Ordinance

- **Require New Construction:**
 - Establish and maintain Ember Resistant Zone within 5 feet of a structure
 - All fire water supply infrastructure additions shall be protected from wildfire radiant heat, convective heat and embers
- **Recommend current property owners:**
 - Remove any combustible outdoor furniture
 - Clean all fallen leave and needles regularly, often during fire season
 - Do not store firewood, lumber or combustibles, especially under decks or overhangs



COUNTYWIDE WILDFIRE PROTECTION PLAN



- Napa County's first-ever Countywide Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) is a roadmap to reduce fuels and prevent wildfires
- **5-year plan:** \$41 million
- Board invested \$1 million to immediately kick off work and will invest \$5.4 million in the FY 21/22 budget for year 1 projects
- Projects are prioritized based on:
 - Evacuation corridors for ingress & egress
 - Community fuel breaks
 - Critical infrastructure
 - Drinking water protection





- Board established an Ad Hoc Committee to provide technical guidance regarding fire prevention and mitigation measures to address current and future needs.
- Ad Hoc Goals:
 - Coordinate efforts to assess fire prevention & suppression
 - Communicate and Collaborate among different agencies
 - Provide recommendations to the Board of Supervisors
 - The intent is to systematically expand membership to include community members and city/town representation
 - Identify sustainable funding resources
- Committee Members: Fire Chief, Sheriff, Supervisors Pedroza & Gregory, Representatives from Napa Firewise, Director of Planning, Director of Emergency Services
