I Foundations

- Marin Community Foundation
 - -funds for restoration plans or outreach

Napa Community Foundation

Review

- + Usually flexible
- -Few and far between
- -Usually small amounts

II Grants

State

IRWM-Prop 84

Napa has Been awarded over \$ 7.5 m in first 3 rounds of IRWM

Review

- + Large amounts available
- 25% match,
 Prop 1 going up to 50 %(tied to water supply)
- complicated process

<u>Other</u>

- DFWS- more Funding in Prop 1
- SCC- funds for projects in Napa

II Grants

- Federal
 - EPA
 - WQIF-Napa has been awarded over \$ 6.5 m in last 5 years
 - 319 ?
 - Other-
 - NOAA- Through DFWS
 - NRCS

Other – Mitigation funds

III Local Funding

Taxes

- Napa Measure A
 - 1998-Sales Tax increase- .5% for 20 years (ENDS IN 2018)
 - ~ \$240 m total
 - 67 % voter approval
- Santa Clara-Measure B-
 - \$ 548 million Parcel Tax for flood improvement and watersheds 2012- 74% voter approval

Fees

Ross Valley-Marin County-\$ 40 million

- 2007-Prop 218 fee election- barely passed
- Challenged in Court-State Supreme Court ruled in favor of county in 2010

Local Funding

Regional

- -San Francisco Bay Restoration Authority
 - Created in 2008- Legislation
- -raise and allocate resources for the restoration, enhancement, protection, and enjoyment of wetlands and wildlife habitat in the San Francisco Bay and along its shoreline, as well as related public recreation and flood protection projects.
- -Evaluated support for a November 2014 regional parcel tax measure- decided to delay
- Agencies
 - SCWA
 - MMWD

Local funding

- Plus
 - Can target purpose
 - Fewer constraints
 - Provides match for federal or state funds
- BIG Minus
 - Upfront voter approval
 This is the biggest challenge
