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Overview of the NCSPPP

- Consortium of entities formed as JPA:
 - American Canyon
 - City of Napa
 - County of Napa
 - St. Helena
 - Yountville
 - Calistoga
 - Flood Control District *
- Regulated under a Phase II NPDES permit:

Allows discharge stormwater from MS4...

If they follow BMPs (best management practices)

- Existing permit issued in 2003; new permit coming soon....
- Regulations stem from the Clean Water Act
 - Phase II small MS4s, ie. <100,000 population
 - Phase I large MS4s, ie. > 100,000 population

^{*} not named as discharger in NPDES permit

6 Minimum Control Measures

- Public Education
- Public Participation
- Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
- Construction Site Storm Water Runoff Control
- Post Construction Storm Water Management
- Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations

6 Minimum Control Measures

Napa County Stormwater Pollution Prevention Program

Program Funding

- Parcel tax assessments ~ 20%
- General Fund ~ 80%
- Program Budget in FY 2012/2013 = \$218,740*

* This does NOT include money spent by individual cities/towns/Co. on their own individual programs.
