


WATERSHED

A region that catches rain and snow and drains it into a particular body of water such as a river, pond, bay, lake, or ocean. Watersheds are more than just drainage areas; they are the places where we live, work, and recreate.

TRIBUTARIES

From small to large, creeks collect water running off the hills and mountains, and deliver it to the main waterway.

HEADWATERS

Where it all begins. Water collects and flows over the land in little rivulets.

OUR COMMUNITIES

What we do on the land affects our water. Keeping our waterways clean and healthy is everyone's responsibility.

ESTUARY

Where the river meets the bay or ocean. Fresh and salt water mix to form a unique habitat zone for plants and animals.

RIVER

The main waterway in the region collecting and moving water from tributaries to a larger body of water.


