



Seven Principles of Bay-Friendly Landscaping

1 Landscape Locally; built landscapes are a part of a larger ecosystem and can contribute to it's health if designed and maintained using sustainable practices.

Candscape for Less to the Landfill; reduce waste, use recycled /salvaged



products, use compost, mulch and grasscycle plant debris. 3 Nurture the Soil; when landscape practices allow the soil food web to thrive it can filter pollution, store water, provide plant nutrients, and help plants resist pests naturally.

4 Conserve Water; create drought resistant soils with compost and mulch, select plants naturally adapted to summer-dry climates, use stormwater, greywater and recycled water and efficient irrigation systems that include self adjusting, weather-based controllers.

reduce the need for mowing and shearing, shade buildings and paved areas, use efficient outdoor lighting, and buy local.

Protect Water & Air Quality; maximize permeable surfaces, minimize stormwater runoff, use integrated pest management, minimize use of synthetic pesticides and fertilizers, reduce fossil fuel consumption, and plant trees to remove CO2 and absorb air pollutants.

Create Wildlife Habitat; biodiversity is crucial to the health of natural ecosystems and increasing the diversity of plantings, the built landscape can provide food, water and shelter for birds, butterflies and beneficial insects.


